BAREFOOT BLUES dueled from the outside, inched away nearing the eighth pole then drew clear. PEDIATRICS was forwardly placed early four wide, showed some effort late and gained the place. D E HIGH COURT dueled from the inside, flattened in the stretch but held the show. FAITHFUL BEAU raced mid pack, placed a bid three wide and was gaining mildly. MUSTBEJOHNSFAULT was off slow and showed a steady effort throughout. SEVENFIFTYNINE was allowed to settle early and lacked a late response. WEST TEXAS EXPRESS was within striking distance early between foes then weakened. TWO WILD SUMMERS was outrun early and improved his position in the stretch. SHY JOEY chased the early leaders racing off the rail, gave way in the stretch, fell after wire and was vanned off. STONEY RUN retreated steadily and was eased to the wire.
